

## Recycling to Start at Lindbrook Transfer Station

After months of anticipation, the Resource Recovery Area is set to open at Lindbrook Transfer Station. Why is Beaver Municipal Solutions calling this a Resource Recovery Area instead of a Recycling Area? All materials collected in this project are not necessarily being recycled, as some are being diverted for other purposes.

For example, materials such as clean wood and brush are being separated from the waste stream. It is being collected so it can be chipped, and used on access roads at the landfill, and possibly even at the transfer



station to address mud and dust issues. This is why it is very important that no nails, screws, or metal brackets are left on these wood materials dropped off in the Resource Recovery Area. If it contains nails, it will need to go into the waste bin. This includes items like old pallets.

You can now drop off your mixed paper and cardboard at the Resource Recovery Area at Lindbrook. Cardboard needs to be flattened, with all Styrofoam and plastic liners removed. It will be shipped for recycling so it is important that it not be contaminated with these or other items.

Metal items, including Freon-containing appliances, will also be accepted at Lindbrook year round. There will be a charge of \$25 per appliance for the Freon removal, which can be paid at the Transfer Station Office.

There are a number of other recycling and diversion programs that will now be located at Lindbrook Transfer Station. Come and check them out! This is a pilot project to determine whether there is enough interest for these types of programs. If successful, it can be replicated elsewhere in the county and potentially other programs added to the Lindbrook site.
